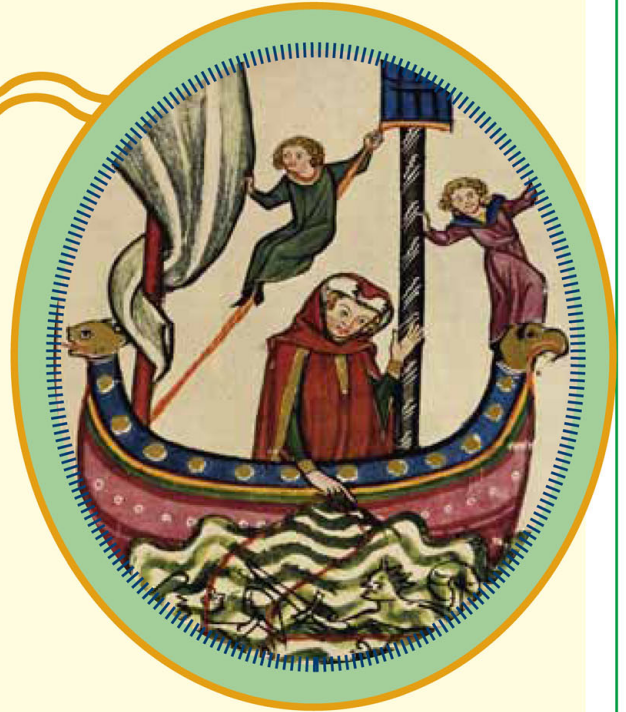


THE DYNAMICS OF EXCHANGE AND IDENTITY
